Find Flu Vaccine Information with Ne211.org *Quick Search* Link

LINCOLN, Neb. (January 6, 2010) – National Influenza Vaccination Week begins January 10, 2010, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Web site. A “Flu Vaccines” *Quick Search* link on the www.ne211.org home page is an easy way to search for county health departments and other organizations providing flu vaccines in Nebraska. Address, telephone number, and hours are given for organizations listed on ne211.org.

Ne211.org also includes information on programs that provide services such as *food banks, homeless shelters, counseling, support groups, drug and alcohol rehabilitation, financial assistance, job training, respite care, senior centers, child care, recreation programs, and disaster relief*. Users can target their search results to a specific geographic area by entering a ZIP Code and miles to search.

The Ne211.org online directory is the web-based sister to 2-1-1, the three-digit phone service that connects callers looking for human services information to a certified information and referral specialist. Information is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week in 39 Nebraska counties and eight counties in southwest Iowa, simply by dialing 2-1-1. Callers outside these areas, or those using a cell phone, can reach the call center by dialing (402) 444-6666. Interpretation assistance for more than 150 languages is available to those calling 2-1-1. Both the Web site and call center are confidential and free.
